Executive Summary

Aishwarya Multiple Campus, established in 2063 B.S., is a leading community campus in the farwest province of Nepal. It has contributed a lot to uplift higher education providing quality education through different programs. There are BBS and MBS under Management stream, B.Sc. in Science. It is anticipated to launch BBA, BBM in near future. From its inception onward, the role, responsibility and commitment of the educationalists, social activists, political representatives, guardians and students is highly praiseworthy for its growth and development. Campus has defined its own vision, mission, goals and objectives.

Aishwarya Multiple Campus has sufficient infra-structures to run the current programs, but to added new programs require further buildings for new classes. Now the campus has the following physical facilities and land. Land -10 kattha, Main Building (3- storey), Science lab Building (2- storey), seminar hall-2, computer lab-1, Health Care Room-1, Bike and bicycle stand-2, Spacious canteen-1, Department chambers-3, Learning Resources Well developed computer lab, Well equipped science labs, Multimedia projector rooms-26, e-library 1, Extension of internet access for students in labs, library and in department chambers.

As a result of the collective efforts of all the stakeholders of this campus, AMC has been awarded with the Quality Assurance and Accreditation Certificate from University Grant Commission, Nepal, as well as with the Best Community Campus award from the Ministry of Social Development, Farwest province Government. 1. Background

Aishwarya Multiple Campus is a community-based campus located to the Far west province of Nepal. It is one of the leading community campuses in Nepal, situated in Kailali district, Dhangadhi sub-metropolitan city, ward no. 05. Initially AMC was basically the educational center for the local people. However, at present, its catchment area is extended to the eastern part of Kailali, Western part of Kanchanpur, and other seven hilly and mountain district of Far-west province. AMC was established in 2063 B.S. with the great endeavor and contribution of educationists, social activities, politicians and local community to attain easy access for academic education in the local areas. In the beginning year, it commenced Science program in bachelor level. Later, as per the need and importance, the campus extended BBS and MBS programs. Campus General Assembly is the supreme legislative as well as executive body of the campus. It is responsible for formation, implementation and supervision of the budget. It provides executive power to campus management committee to run the campus.

Mission

The mission of AMC is to serve the students, communities and the region through quality, affordable and accessible academic and career oriented education with superior talent that is sensitive to corporate governance, social responsibility, environmental concerns, scientific research and beliefs.





Figure No. 2 Pass number in BSc. for last three years.







- Guardin and local educationalist Provides various support by providing suggestions in teacher guardian meeting



6.1 Strength

- ii) The campus is located in the main market of Dhangadhi, the headquarters of Kailali district, the temporary capital of the state, and the main trade gateway to the far west. Therefore, the campus is located in a place that is suitable for all students
- iii) The campus has received a Quality Assurance Accreditation Certificate from the University Grants Commission. Similarly, the campus has been selected as a model campus of the province by the Ministry of Social Development of the Far Western Provincial Government.

iv) This campus is the only campus of the oldest and largest Tribhuvan University in Nepal in Dhangadhi sub-metropolis.

6.2 Weakness

- i) The campus has only two faculties for a long time
- ii) There is no semester program at the undergraduate level
- iii) Although it is the first campus of the Seti region in science, only a general B.Sc. is conducted at the undergraduate level and there is no semester program.
- iv) There is a lack of physical infrastructure in proportion to the student growth of the campus

6.3 Challenges

Campus has many challenges. Short run and long run challenges are as following

6.3.1 Short term issue and challenges

- 1. Generation of additional resources for implanting capital expenditure
- 2. Providing research culture in the campus.
- Difficulty in exchange a variety of approaches, such as: the workshop pioneered in physics and mathematics; focus group discussion, action research, project works, the use of oral history and community project.

6.3.2 Long term issue and challenges

- 1. Financial stability is the main challenge. Students fee are not sufficient for the total expenditure of campus.
- 2. To fulfill the demand of students for new subjects and faculty.
- 3. Faculty development
- 4. Current infrastructure may not fulfill the need of future.

6.4 Mitigation measure taken to address the issue

- 1. Campus has established Research cell for the development of research culture
- 2. Campus has prepared proposal for master degree program and wish to apply for program as soon as T.U. announce for application.
- 3. AMC submitted its delegation to state ministry and Dhangadhi sub metropolitan for financial aid. It has been selected and got fund.

Plan for addressing the issues and challenges

- 1. Campus has formulated its five years strategic plan for its overall development.
- 2. It has plan to extend its academic program for more income sources
- 3. In its strategic plan it has plan to develop its faculty by encouraging in research and further study for its faculty member.
- 4. It has planned to enroll more students by encouraging educationally disadvantage students.
- 5. It has planned to construct new building to address the increasing demand of students
